FG TO RESUSCITATE EXISTING SPECIAL TERRORISM PROSECUTION COURTS - MALAMI

The Attorney-General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, Abubakar Malami, SAN has said that the Federal government will, through the Federal Ministry of Justice Complex Case Group resuscitate and invigorate the existing special terrorism prosecution courts.

Malami made this known in a statement issued by his Special Assistant on Media and Public Relations, Dr. Umar Jibrilu Gwandu, on Thursday 14th May, 2021. He



said the move is geared towards Federal Government's commitment to ending insecurity in the country. The statement said that, "the Federal Government is committed to ending insecurity in the country, and added that the courts are to bring to book all those found guilty so as to serve as deterrence to others". "In addition to the prosecution of 400 suspected Boko Haram financiers, the government has taken more measures to counter the twin trouble of insurgency and insecurity in the country". Malami also while

felicitating with Muslim faithful all over the world on the occasion of this year's Eid Al-Fitr, noted that the Ramadan Fast comes with numerous lessons including sincerity, honesty and commitment, sacrifice, selflessness, introspection and empathy among others.

He therefore, urged Muslims as they celebrate Eid-fitr to continue to be law-abiding, have sober reflection and exhibit the imbibed lessons learnt during the period of Ramadan fast.

The Minister saluted the commitment of clerics in enlightening their followers on various issues during the months urging them to maintain the tempo even beyond the period of Ramadan.
